International MBA (i-MBA)

2026 Academic Year Admission Guidelines

1. Admission Policy for the Professional Degree Program

The Graduate School of Management (GSM) aims at educating advanced professionals who can provide leadership in a wide range of fields. The admission policy establishes required experience, knowledge, learning skills and mindset for candidates who wish to study at GSM. This policy also describes evaluation criteria used in the admission process.

In our professional program, we have developed lectures and courses that bridge theory and practice based on our curriculum policy. We. accept candidates of high caliber from a wide range of diverse backgrounds under this policy, such as undergraduate students from various disciplines, those with extensive work experience, and international students. Candidates are expected to have basic knowledge in management science and sound intellectual curiosity. In order to accept diverse students, GSM employs a variety of selection processes including those specifically designed for candidates with professional working experience and for English programs.

We determine successful applicants based on the overall results of written examinations, essays, interviews, academic and work records, and other relevant information. We specify details of evaluation on the admission guidelines. During evaluation, we give equal consideration to applicants from our university and from other universities. We do not discriminate against any applicant to this course for any reasons such as race, religion, gender, age, nationality, political ideology, or physical disability.

Our mission and policies expect that eligible candidates possess the following characteristics.
 Individuals who have a strong will to work on the complex issues that current management is facing with theoretically, practically, and ethically.

- (2) Individuals who work hard and encourage each other in the classes of GSM. They should possess intellectual curiosity and social role consciousness.
- (3) Individuals who have basic knowledge in management science and broad knowledge in general and are able to apply knowledge and skills in reality.

2. Outline for i-MBA

International MBA is a program offered only in English. It is a program that leads to a general management degree while helping students develop their vision and the skills to achieve their ambitions. Students get the business knowledge and specialized skills to expand their career choices. This program provides wide area of expertise in business leadership, service & hospitality management, as well as finance and accounting. It offers an educational curriculum in which students can learn how businesses can thrive while also contribute to sustainable development.

4. Application Eligibility Requirement

Applicants must match at least one of the following requirements (by March 31, 2026):

- (1) Individuals who have graduated (or are expected to graduate by March 31, 2026) from a Japanese university.
- (2) Individuals who have received (or are expected to complete by March 31, 2026) a bachelor's degree in accordance with the regulations stipulated in Section Paragraph 4, Article 104 of the School Education Law.
- (3) Individuals who have completed (or are expected to complete by March 31, 2026) 16 years of education. [See note 1.]
- (4) Individuals who have completed (or are expected to complete by March 31, 2026) an equivalent of 16 years of foreign school education through distance learning while residing in Japan.
- (5) Individuals who have completed (or are expected to complete by March 31, 2026) a foreign university curriculum in Japan (only if completion of the curriculum is treated as completion of 16 years of school education in the said foreign country) at an educational facility that has been accredited as having an approved curriculum under the educational system of the said country and is also designated by the Minister of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (hereinafter referred to "the Minister of MEXT") in Japan.
- (6) Individuals who have received (or are expected to complete by March 31, 2026) a bachelor's degree (including degrees equivalent thereto) by completing at least 3 years of education in a foreign university or a foreign institution (including by completing a foreign school education through distance learning while residing in Japan and by completing a foreign university curriculum in Japan at an educational facility accredited as having an approved curriculum under the educational system of the said country and is also designated by the Minister of MEXT).
- (7) Individuals who have completed an advanced professional course at a higher vocational school designated by the Minister of MEXT, on or after the date designated by the Minister of MEXT.
- (8) Individuals designated by the Minister of MEXT.
- (9) Individuals who have been enrolled more than 3 years in a university, but have not yet completed a degree, and are determined by the Graduate School of Management to have received excellent achievement ratings in prescribed subjects. [See note 2.]
- (10) Individuals who are determined by the Graduate School of Management to have completed an education equivalent to a university degree and are at least 22 years old by March 31, 2026. [See note 2.]

- [Note 1] Requirement (3) includes individuals who have completed an equivalent of 16 years of education but have less than 16 years due to skipped (advanced) grades.
- [Note 2] Those who are applying under requirement (9) or (10) must undergo a preliminary eligibility screening process before applying. <u>However, you will be required to go through the Admissions</u> <u>Assistance Office (AAO) first</u> and if further verification is needed, you will be asked to undergo a preliminary eligibility screening.

The deadline for preliminary eligibility screening is <u>July 4 (Fri), 2025</u>. If you are unsure about your application eligibility, please go through AAO with plenty of time. Applications that have not undergone AAO or preliminary eligibility screening for requirement (9) or (10) will not be accepted.

5. Eligibility Verification

If you have graduated (expected to graduate) from a university (bachelor's degree) outside of Japan or applicants who are applying under requirement (9) or (10) of 4. Application Eligibility Requirement, please go through the Admissions Assistance Office (AAO) by the start of the online application period.

Applicants who have graduated from universities in Japan do not need to take this procedure. Please apply directly to the online application system within the application period.

[Notes]

- (1) The Graduate School of Management does not require any contact with faculty or research topics when applying.
- (2) Enter "i-MBA" for your desired faculty and research theme.
- (3) After downloading a designated form of "Statement of Purpose," leave it blank (enter nothing) and attach it.
- (4) Once your application through AAO is accepted, you will receive an AAO ID (5 digits). This ID will be used during the online application process.
- (5) If you have been approved by AAO as eligible for admission before, you do not need to apply for AAO again. Please have your previously issued AAO ID ready. In case you have lost your previous AAO ID, please contact AAO.
- (6) If you fall under the following cases, please contact the Graduate School of Management before proceeding to the next page without entering your AAO ID in the online application system.
 - There are changes in your academic information at the time of admission application
 - You have applied to AAO before September 2021
- (7) Even if you have a master's degree from a university in Japan but your bachelor's degree is from a university outside of Japan, you must go through AAO.
- (8) The result of your eligibility check will be informed to the Graduate School of Management Administrative Office directly. You do not need to submit any document about your AAO result to the online application system.
- (9) Personal Information, Educational Background and Certificates you have input in the AAO system will be reflected automatically to the online application system. Gender, Nationality, Educational Background and Certificates cannot be edited.

*Email and phone inquiries regarding application eligibility cannot be answered for any reason.

6. Online Application

(1) Online Application Period August 18 (Monday) – September 5 (Friday), 2025, 5pm (JST)

(2) Online Application System

All applicants are required to submit an admission application through the following website.

*<u>Make sure to go through AAO first before registering for the online application system.</u>

(Check 5. Eligibility Verification)

*Accounts for AAO and the online application system are separate. You must register an account for the admission in addition to AAO.

*You may not apply for both KC-CDO and i-MBA in the same academic year.

(3) Application Fee Payment

Application Fee: 10,000 Yen (+ commission fee)

Payment can be made through the online application system.

You can choose a payment method from credit card, convenience store, ATM or internet banking.

*Do not proceed with any further application process such as payment of application fee or registering the online application system until you receive the AAO results.

*If you are admitted to the Graduate School of Management as a Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship student <u>as of the enrollment date</u>, the application fee will be refunded. The commission fee will not be refunded.

7. Application Documents

All application documents must be uploaded and submitted on the online application system of Kyoto University. Uploads should be in PDF format and make sure that all texts and photos are clearly shown. You will be asked to resubmit them if any items are unclear.

1. Photo	Upload one photo in jpeg (facing forward, from shoulder up, no hat, and taken within the last 3 months).
2. Passport	Upload an ID page with applicant's name, photo, passport number, expiration date and place of issue.
3. Academic Transcript	Upload an academic transcript (bachelor's degree) certified by your university president/department head from which you graduated. Only English and Japanese language documents will be accepted. If the certificate in English or Japanese is not available at your university, translation by authority must be uploaded as well.

4. (Expected) Certificate of Graduation	Upload the (Expected) Certificate of Graduation (bachelor's degree) certified by your university president/department head from which you graduated.
	Only English and Japanese language documents will be accepted. If the certificate in English or Japanese is not available at your university, translation by authority must be uploaded as well. Applicants from a Chinese university can submit a certificate in Chinese following the instructions from AAO.
5. Two Letters of Recommendation (Form 1)	The applicant should get two recommendation letters in English or Japanese in the designated Recommendation Letter form from a relevant university professor or social standing person (e.g. your supervisor / boss in a workplace) via the online application system. Please ask for a recommendation letter from two different people. Do not submit extra (three or more) letters. If the requested person has not uploaded the recommendation letter by the deadline, your application will be passed on to the admission selection committee without a recommendation letter.
6. Educational and Professional Plans (Form 2)	Respond to the questions on the "Educational and Professional Plans" form. Answer each question within the designated length and upload the "Educational and Professional Plans" form.
7. TOEFL or IELTS Score	Only scores from one of the following test types taken after January 1st, 2023 will be accepted. Scores other than the following are not accepted. English proficiency levels with TOEFL iBT: 80 or more, or IELTS: 7.0 or more are desirable.
	<u>TOEFL</u> : Copies of the Official Score Report for TOEFL iBT (Internet- Based Test) or TOEFL iBT Home Edition will be accepted.
	<u>IELTS</u> : Copies of the Official Test Report Form (TRF) for IELTS will be accepted.
	 *TOEIC scores will not be accepted for any reason. * If scores are not submitted by the deadline (application period), TOEFL or IELTS scores will be recorded as zero.
	English proficiency test scores are exempted if any of the following apply:
	 (1) Citizens or permanent residents of the United States, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, or Canada (except Quebec). (2) Applicants with a bachelor's degree from a university in a country where English is the native language (the United States, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, or Canada (except Quebec)).
	 (3) You have taken all courses for a bachelor degree in English and graduated from a university in a country where English is not the native language.
	 *You must provide an official certificate or letter for Medium of Instruction. *Not applicable if you have completed all courses in the master's degree in English.
8. GMAT or GRE score	Upload your score for GMAT or GRE taken after January 1st, 2021.
	The Official Score Report in pdf for the following tests are accepted:
	 GMAT Exam (GMAT Focus Edition) GMAT 10th edition GRE

	*Scores from tests taken online are accepted. *For GMAT, if your score is not given in pdf, you can send your score via mba.com. to our institution [Graduate School of Management, International MBA Programs (T6H-B2-81)] and upload the screenshot of your score shown online. Include the appointment ID in it. *Submissions of GMAT or GRE scores are not required but strongly recommended. If the scores are not submitted by the deadline, you will be assessed with 0 points for GMAT/GRE.
9. Video Essay (Online)	After completing the application fee payment, you will be invited to record an online video essay. Details will be provided via email. Please make sure to pay the application fee as early as you can to put aside time to do the recording for the video essay. *The deadline for the video essay is the same as the online application deadline.
10. Receipt of Application Fee	Complete your payment via the Kyoto University Examination Settlement System (EXSS) and upload an evidence of your payment (e.g. an email for payment completion or a receipt etc.).

[Notes]

- (1) An application missing necessary documents will not be considered.
- (2) Correction or replacement of application documents after the deadline is impossible.
- (3) Supplementary materials in addition to the documents requested above will not be considered.
- (4) An application will not be accepted if registration in the online application system and payment of the application fee through the EXSS have not been completed.
- (5) The application fee will not be refunded after the application has been accepted.

8. Selection Process

The board will evaluate the applicant's motivation to study and fundamental abilities to study various areas of management based on the submitted application documents and video essay.

9. Announcement of Successful Applicants

(2) How to check the admission's result

The announcement is published on the online application system. Please log in to the system on the announcement day and check the result yourself. A letter of admission will be downloadable for successful applicants.

*Telephone or email inquiries regarding the result will not be answered.

*We do not inform applicants of the reasons for rejection or conduct a second view.

10. Enrollment Date

11. Admission and Tuition Fees

Successful applicants who have paid the admission fee will be notified of details regarding the enrollment process around March 2026.

*No admission fee or tuition will be charged to Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship students. *The admission and tuition fees indicated above are tentative and may be revised.

*If the above amounts are revised at the time of enrollment or after enrollment, the new amounts will apply.

12. ADB-JSP Scholarship

Graduate School of Management is one of the designated institutions under the Asian Development Bank-Japan Scholarship Program (ADB-JSP).

If you wish to apply for ADB-JSP, submit an application form with the admission application documents. Earlier or later submission apart from your admission application will not be accepted. *Check your application eligibility and requirements on the ADB's website before you apply.

- (1) All indicated dates and times are Japan Standard Time (JST).
- (2) Notify the Graduate School of Management Administrative Office immediately if your contact information changes. Notification will only be accepted by email (notification by telephone will not be accepted).
- (3) For inquiries after application, please also inform us of the application number.
- (4) Please note that if any false information is found in the application documents, application may be cancelled even after acceptance or enrollment.

- (2) Your name, address and other personal information submitted at the time of application will be used for [1] selection of students (application screening and applicant selection), [2] announcement of successful applicants, and [3] to conduct enrollment procedures.
- (3) The application screening data used to select admitted applicants will be included in documents used to determine future selection processes.
- (4) The personal information of enrolled students submitted at the time of application will be used for [1] educational affairs (school register, educational guidance, etc.), [2] student support (health management, employment support, tuition exemption, scholarship applications, etc.), and [3] collection of tuition.
